

# JAMES W. "BILL" HEAVENER FOOTBALL COMPLEX AND BULL GATOR PLAZA

The Heavener Football Complex is everything we dreamed it would be and more. It has become the front door of our football program and has allowed us to pay tribute to the former Gator Greats and Championship teams. It also provides us with a venue to host our prospective student-athletes and is the crowning jewel to the finest football stadium in the country.



The Heavener Football Complex has received platinum certification from the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Building rating System, the highest ranking available. It is the first building in Florida and the first athletic facility in the nation to achieve platinum status. There are only 130 platinum buildings in the U.S. and 141 worldwide. The building is a three-story, 66,650-square-foot air conditioned renovation and expansion.

LEED certification is based on site/location planning, energy use, water management, materials used, indoor environmental quality and innovation in the design process.

**Site related:**

- Utilized the existing building to renovate and add on

**Water related:**

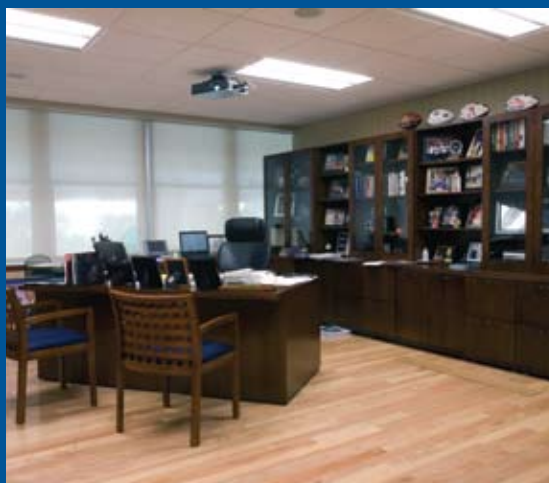
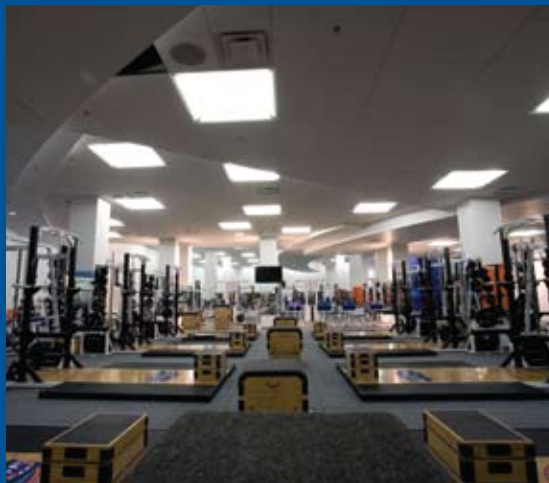
- Used 100 percent reclaimed water for the irrigation
- Used native plants and irrigation system that further decrease the irrigation by 50 percent
- 100 percent of waste water is treated on site (campus)

**Energy related:**

- Included individual comfort controls for more than 50 percent of the building occupants. The HVAC system responds to zones requiring additional cooling or heating (occupied spaces) and can reduce air conditioning services in unoccupied spaces.
- Included individual lighting controls for more than 90 percent of the building occupants to enable adjustments to suit individual task needs and preferences.
- The building is 25 percent more energy efficient than standard buildings
- Installed occupancy sensors throughout the building
- Green power to offset 70 percent of the electrical load on the building

**Material related:**

- LEED rewarded the project for renovating existing buildings over 100 percent new construction. Because this project included existing building area that was renovated, it earned more points in LEED than if it were 100 percent new space.
- All the carpet is from recycled material
- All the weight room flooring is 86 percent recycled rubber tires
